

SAINT OF THE WEEK

JULY 14 IS THE FEAST OF SAINT KATERI TEKAKWITHA

Saint Kateri Tekakwitha is the first Native American to be recognized as a saint by the Catholic Church. She was born in Auriesville, NY, the daughter of a Mohawk chief and an Algonquin woman. When she was only four years old her parents and brother died of smallpox. She survived the disease, but it left her face badly scarred. Kateri was raised by her uncle, who was opposed to Christianity. Against the wishes of her uncle and her tribe, Kateri was baptized into the Catholic faith. She moved to Canada and spent her life with the Mission of St. Francis Xavier, teaching prayers to children and taking care of the sick and the elderly. She was known for her great devotion to the Blessed Sacrament and to the Cross of Jesus.

Kateri died at the young age of 24, and legend holds that her last words were, "Jesus, I love you." Witnesses reported that within moments of her death, her scars from smallpox disappeared and Kateri's face shone with radiant loveliness.

Saint Kateri Tekakwitha is known as The Lily of the Mohawks, and you can visit her shrine in Fonda, New York

Dear Padre,

Recently my husband's union was involved in a messy strike that nearly turned violent. Does the Catholic Church support strikes like this?

I grew up in Detroit. Most of my family and extended family worked in the automobile plants there. I clearly remember long strikes when my father was out of work and our family would struggle along, sometimes wondering where we would get money for the necessities of life.

In the past hundred years, many of the writings of the popes and the bishops' conferences have centered on the issues of work, including the issue of receiving a just wage. The Church spoke in support of child-labor laws, eight-hour workdays, organized unions, collective bargaining, and a just wage. Because of this, at times the Church has been labeled unpatriotic, socialistic, and even communist. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops published a pastoral letter, "Economic Justice for All," which outlines the six moral principles drawn from Scripture that form the basis of the Church's social teaching. In this letter, the Church fully supports the rights of workers to form unions to secure their rights to fair wages and working conditions. Unions may also legitimately resort to strikes when this is the only available means to the justice owed the workers (EJA 104–105). The Church draws the line at violence. The strike becomes morally unacceptable when accompanied by violence (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 2435).
