

Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults

Wednesday September 22nd - 7:00 PM Wednesday September 29th - 7:00 PM St. Peter's Parish Hall

Becoming Catholic as an adult requires individuals to participate in a time of formation known as the **Rite** of Christian Initiation for Adults (R.C.I.A). The word "initiate" means to induct into membership. In the context of Christian initiation, it means the process that prepares you to become a member of the Catholic Church. People who have been thinking of becoming Catholic, who are attached to its beliefs and who seek deeper meaning in their lives may wish to follow these promptings and discover what lies behind them. To help you understand the basic way of Catholic life, we first offer the Inquiry period. These sessions do not bind or commit you to membership in the Catholic Faith. This is the preparation stage and will vary timewise depending on the participant and on God's call in his or her life.

The next phase, which is called the catechumenate, is usually about one year long. During this phase, we meet on Sunday mornings. This time is given to fostering a deeper relationship with the Lord. Our sessions reflect on scripture, church teachings, and a variety of related topics – all in preparation for the reception of the sacraments of **Baptism**, **Confirmation and Eucharist** normally at Easter of that year.
