FORMATION IN A MINUTE...

Why So Many Candles? (Part 1) Walk into any Catholic church and you'll see many candles. Candles on the altar, a candle near the tabernacle, candles flickering before side altars or statues. Go to a baptism and there will be a huge, decorated candle (the Paschal Candle), as well as a candle for the godparents to hold. Attend an Easter Vigil and there will be the same large candle, hand-held candles for the congregation, and a small bonfire outside the church preceding Mass. Then, of course, there are Advent Candles. There's the Blessing of Throats with candles on the feast of St. Blaise. There are altar servers holding candles during the processional into Mass, and the recessional at the end of Mass. The list goes on. Why do Catholics use so many candles?

The Symbolism of Candles in the Liturgy

Throughout Church history, the candle has represented Christ: the perfect candle, THE Light of the World. The Gospel of John gives a poetic description of this reality:

"In [Christ] was life, and the life was the light of men. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it. There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. He came for testimony, to bear witness to the light, that all might believe through him. He was not the light, but came to bear witness to the light. The true light that enlightens every man was coming into the world." (John 1:4-9)
The word "candle" comes from the Latin verb candeo meaning "to

shine, glow, or burn."

Altar Candles

The main use of candles on the altar is to remind us of Christ as the light of the world; however, altar candles also bring to mind the reality that many of the persecuted Christians in the first centuries celebrated Mass secretly at night or in the catacombs, with the only light being candlelight. The fortitude and perseverance of those Christians helped the Faith survive and thrive even into the 21st century.

Candles may also be used in the entrance and recessional processions of the Mass and be lit at the ambo where the Gospel is read, as a sign of triumphant joy in the presence of the words of Christ.

The Sanctuary Lamp

The sanctuary lamp is placed in the church in the vicinity of the tabernacle to remind the faithful of Christ's real Eucharistic presence. It usually has a red cover to distinguish it from other candles in the

Votive Candles

We light candles before altars, images, and statues of Our Lord, Our Lady, and the saints not as an attempt at worship, but as a symbol of the light of faith with which we ask for God's help.

Many people use votive candles in their home and place them in a prayer corner or on a table while they pray.

While we can certainly pray and petition without candles, the physical act of lighting a candle is a chance for us to bring our entire person body, mind, heart, and soul – into the act of praying.
