

## Safe Environment Training

The Diocese of Syracuse requires Safe Environment Training for all clergy, members of a religious order, parish and diocesan employees and adult volunteers whose ministry or role places them in regular contact with children, young people, or vulnerable adults about the prevention of sexual abuse. The required Safe Environment training also teaches attendees how to recognize predatory behaviors, and review proper boundaries, and maintain a culture of awareness, knowledge, and vigilance for those entrusted in our care.

The initial training, <u>Protecting God's Children</u>, is a twohour session for new employees and new volunteers. Recertification training, <u>Entrusted to Protect</u>, <u>Dedicated to</u> <u>Restore</u>, is a one and one half hour session that is required every five years after the initial training is completed. Both training sessions require the completion of a criminal background check.

There are currently two sessions of Safe Environment Training being offered in our area: **Protecting God's Children** (initial training) – Tuesday, June 6 at 10:00AM at St. Joseph's in Lee Center

Entrusted to Protect, Dedicated to Restore (recertification) – Monday, June 5 at 6:00PM at St. Peter's Church.

**Registration is necessary**. Per diocesan instruction, no walk-ins will be allowed. Please visit the diocesan website (www.syracusediocese.org) for more details and to register.

## FORMATION IN A MINUTE...

Jesus' Ascension

After Jesus rose from the dead, he spent 40 days with his disciples, teaching them and sharing meals with them. At the end of the 40 days, he was taken up into heaven at the Mount of Olives. The Acts of the Apostles describes this event:

As [the disciples] were looking on, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him from their sight. While they were looking intently at the sky as he was going, suddenly two men dressed in white garments stood beside them. They said, "Men of Galilee, why are you standing there looking at the sky? This Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven will return in the same way as you have seen him going into heaven." ~Acts of the Apostles 1:9-11

When Jesus ascended into heaven, he told the apostles to wait for the Holy Spirit to come upon them. They stayed and prayed for 9 days until Pentecost Sunday, making the first novena. A novena is a prayer prayed for 9 days and the concept is based on this event.

Why is it important that we remember the Ascension of Jesus?

The ascension reminds us of who Jesus is and the important fact that He has gone to prepare a place for us to join Him when it is time to do so.


## **Distribution of the Precious Blood**


