

FORMATION IN A MINUTE...

SAINT MARY MAGDALENE July 22

Mary Magdalene was a Jewish woman who is known as "Apostle to the Apostles." Historians believe, with much certainty, that she is an historical figure even though very little is known about her life. Her name was Mary, and it is believed she came form the town of Magdala and was known as "The Magdalene" so that she could be distinguished from the many other Marys that traveled with Jesus.

Mary Magdalene was one of the women who traveled with Jesus. She witnessed many of Jesus' miracles, stood at the foot of Jesus' cross, and was present as He died and was buried. She was also on of the first witnesses of Jesus' Resurrection.
