The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

This Liturgical year (Year A) began on the First Sunday of Advent, and it ends today with the Feast of Christ the King. During the Liturgical year, we re-live the life of Christ and try to immerse ourselves in the kingdom he came to establish. This is a time to reflect on our own journey through the past year with Jesus. Reflecting on the teachings we have heard each Sunday from this year's Gospels, Matthew tells us that Jesus of Nazareth is the long-awaited Messiah.

Today's Gospel passage is the conclusion of Jesus' discourse with his disciples. It is about the end of time, the coming of the Son of Man, and the final judgment. Jesus describes to his disciples the scene of the judgment of the Son of Man. The judgments made by the Son of Man will be based upon the acts of mercy shown to the least ones—the hungry, the thirsty, the naked, the ill, and the imprisoned. Indeed, Jesus, who suffered on the Cross, identifies himself with the least ones.

Recall that last week's parable of the talents taught us that the gifts that we have been given are intended to be used for the service of others, especially the least among us. Our judgment before God will be based not only on how we have used these gifts and talents, but also on how we have extended ourselves in service to these least ones.

Family Table Talk

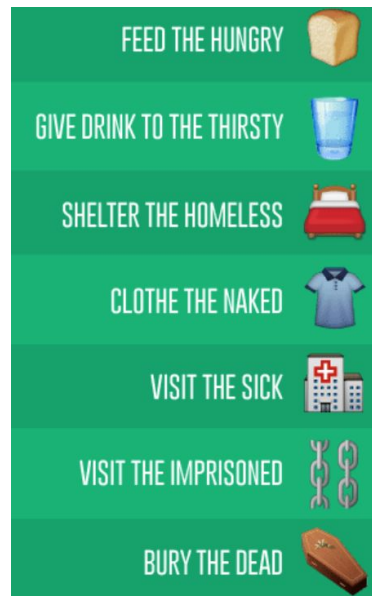
Question for Children: Who are the people most in need of help who live around you, and how can you help them?
